



Klemens H. Fischer, born in 1964, holds a PhD in international law and is Professor of International Relations and Geopolitics at the University of Cologne. From 1993 to 2022, he was a member of the Austrian EU Embassy in Brussels, most recently with the rank of Minister and Head of Department. During this time, he was a member of the Austrian accession negotiating team and the Group of Government Representatives for the Treaty of Nice, among others, and took part in the decisive negotiations on European integration. Between 2011 and 2022, he chaired the Steering Group/ EU High Level Governance Process. At the invitation of the US government, he took part in the International Visitor Programme of the United States of America in 1997.

Parallel to his professional activities, Fischer took on his first teaching assignment at the Institute for Media and Communication at the Technical University of Berlin in 1997. In 2001, he was invited to Auburn University/College of Business as a Lowder Visiting Executive. From 1997 to 2010, he taught at the Institute of Political Science at the University of Siegen, where he habilitated in political science with a *venia legendi* in international relations in 2006. In 2008, he accepted an invitation from the University of Cologne, where he has been teaching ever since. Fischer was a guest lecturer at the Rotman School of Management at the University of Toronto from 1999 to 2004, at the European School of Management and Technology (ESMT) in Berlin from 1999 to 2022, at the European Institute for Public Administration (EIPA) from 2013 to 2016, at the Institute for Management and Technological Training (POTHO) in Finland from 2003 to 2015, and at the Diplomatic Academy in Vienna from 2017 to 2021.

Fischer is a member of the International Institute for Strategic Studies (IISS) in London and Board Member and Senior Adviser at the Austrian Institute for European and Security Policy in Vienna.

Fischer publishes regularly on European and international law, international relations and lobbying. In the EU context, he has published commentaries on the Treaty of Nice, the Convention on the Future of Europe, the European Constitutional Treaty, the Treaty of Lisbon, and the Evolution of the EU Treaties, as well as textbooks on EU business-government relations and EU lobbying. In the context of international relations and geopolitics, Fischer is, *inter alia*, co-editor of the AIES Series on European and Security Policy, where he is currently editor-in-chief for a multi-volume series on the future of European security policy, and publishes articles on the stability of European security and defence policy, the enforceability of the rule of law in international relations, and a textbook on international relations and geopolitics.
